Poverty Alleviation

Strengthen the Jamati/AKDN institutional response to poverty alleviation, focusing on coordinated delivery, data, habitat and housing, financial access and inclusion

Based on a well-researched understanding of Jamati needs for access to finance for education, health, housing and SMEs, dialogue with AKFED and Jamati financial institutions to address these effectively

Early Childhood Development (ECD)

Accelerate access to ECD in both urban and rural areas towards a 100% target

Strengthen the key institutions' long term financial sustainability and operational capacity, including establishing endowments

Universities

Strengthen the financial stability of the Aga Khan University and the University of Central Asia; accelerate the development of their graduate schools

Substantially progress the initiatives concerning water and energy access for Central Asian Jamats
